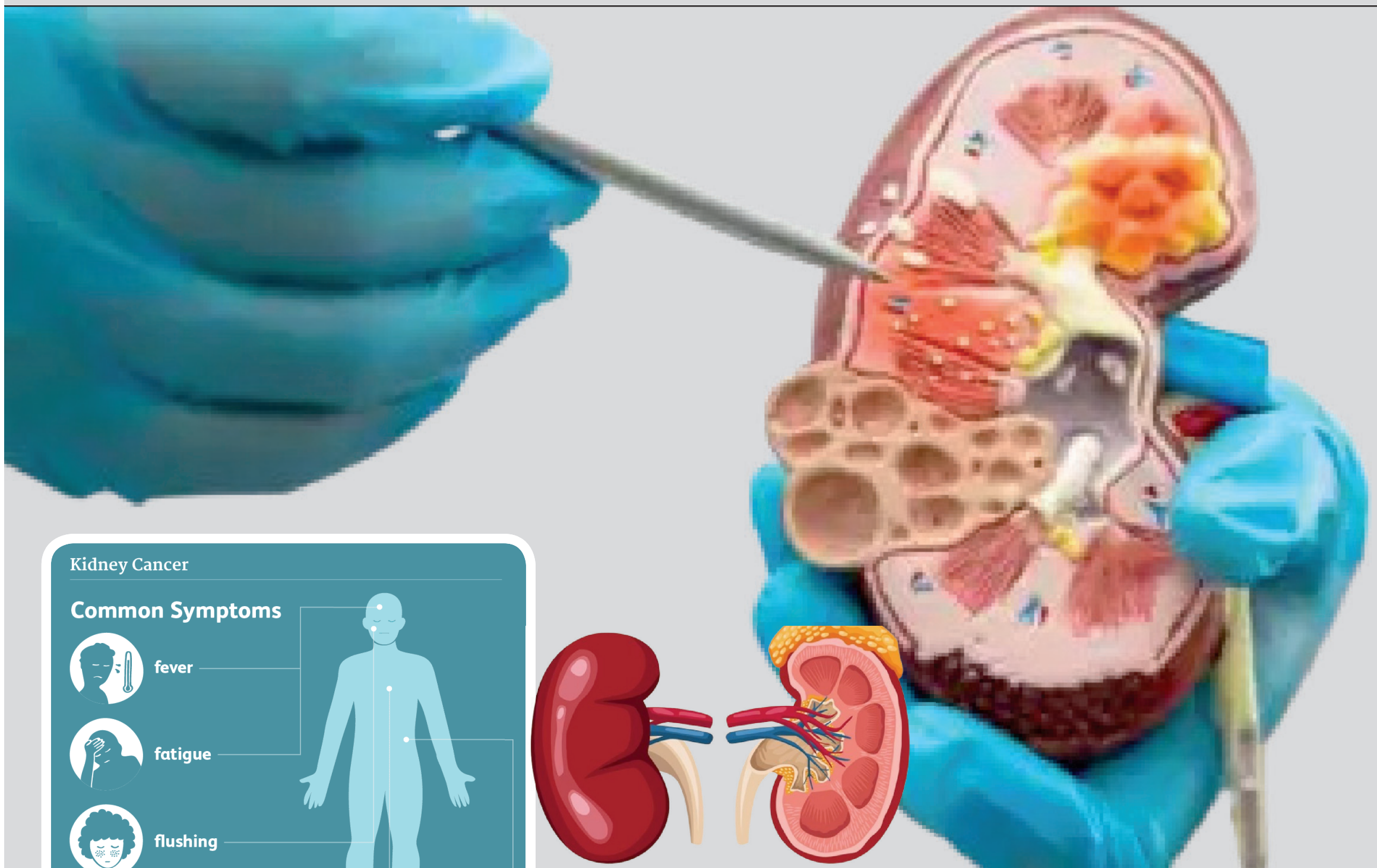

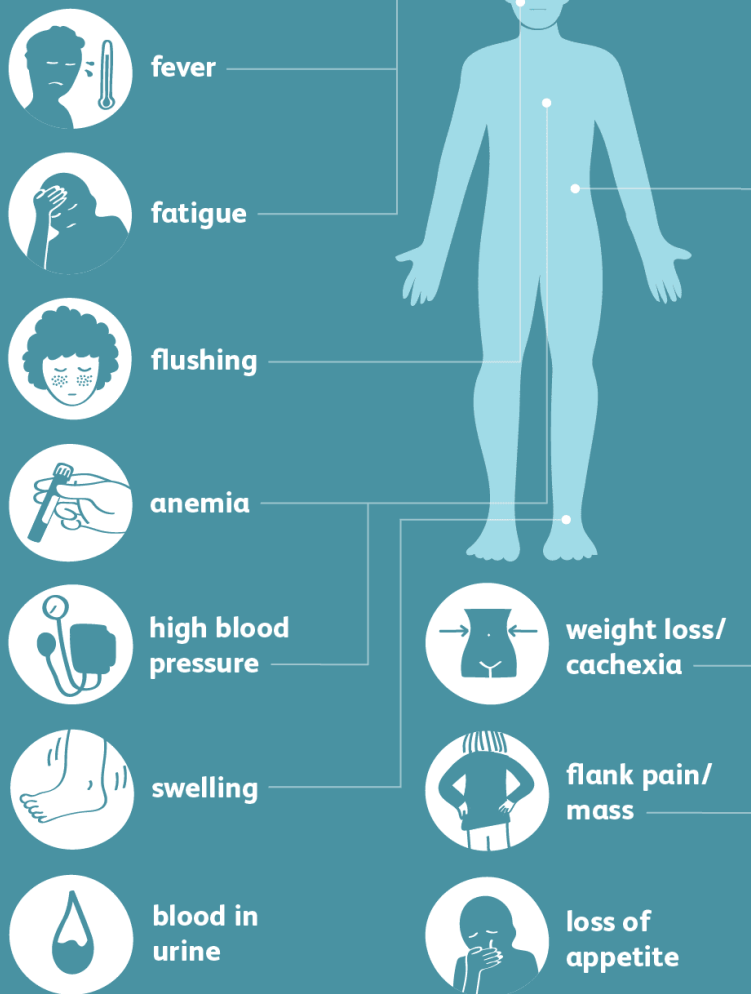

As per statistics, it has come into the vision that 1 in 442 men and 1 in 600 women in India is at risk of developing kidney cancer, with an observation that men have higher chances over women of suffering from the disease.

Causes of kidney cancer

Kidney cancer doesn't have a fixed cause, but there are practices termed as 'risk factors' that are responsible for causing the disease. Smoking, Obesity radiation therapy, long-term dialysis treatment, and high blood pressure are a few causes of kidney cancer. Also, if an individual's family member had been a kidney patient in the past, then it may affect the one and cause kidney cancer.

Symptoms of kidney cancer

Kidney cancer is the type of cancer that may or

may not show its symptoms in the early stages but still can be identified if observed carefully.

Blood in the urine

A patient suffering from kidney cancer usually has a high amount of blood in their body, which results in changing the colour of their urine when they pee, appearing pink or dark brown.

Dr. Bhavna Bansal Senior Consultant and HOD, Histopathology - Oncquest laboratories says, "Patients may often lose their appetite due to the pain, sickness or breathlessness. Since one feels extremely tired or fed up eating food. This is mostly observed in the advanced stages of cancer, aligned with the other common symptoms like fever, body pain, stomach ache, and fatigue."

Lump in flank area

If an individual feels a lump or mass in the kidney area, then it is a serious symptom of the cancer, and one should see a doctor. However, there are times when these lumps are too small to be noticed by patients or even doctors, for which ultrasounds can be tried.

Intense pain in back or sides

Individuals who feel intense pain in their back or sides between the ribs and the hips might be kidney cancer patients. Even the pain in their lower back is also a symptom of the disease, if one keeps getting this pain, then see the doctor and get the cancer tests done to avoid future complications.

Diagnosis of kidney cancer

There are four stages of kidney cancer which are diagnosed after certain tests like ultrasound, CT Scan, biopsy and urine tests. After which, the treatment usually begins with the removal of cancer via surgical (Nephrectomy) or non-surgical (cryoablation and radiofrequency ablation) treatments.

Kidney cancer is the type of cancer which needs to be observed carefully based on its symptoms as it spreads faster and shows its major symptoms after it has reached stage II or above. Like other types, this cancer is also curable in its early stages before it breaks through the outer covering of the kidney.

India Creates World Record With 64.2 Crore Voter Turnout: Cec

New Delhi, June 3 (UNI) India created a world record with 64.2 crore voters, including 31.2 crore women, participating in the Lok Sabha elections this year, Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said on Monday. Addressing a press conference a day before the counting of votes, Rajiv Kumar said, "This is a historic moment for all of us. This is just to give you some small statistics. This is 1.5 times of the voters of all G7 countries - US, UK, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Canada.. all put together. We are comparing voters and it is 2.5 times of the voters of 27 countries in the EU".



"That has been the incredible power of the voters of India. There are 312 million proud women voters.

This is also the highest ever in the world" he added. "Over 68,000 monitoring

Jammu And Kashmir Set To Hold Assembly Polls As Election Commission Gives The Green Light

Srinagar, June 03: The Election Commission of India made a significant announcement on Monday regarding the readiness to hold assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir. Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar highlighted the impressive voter turnout in the Union Territory during the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, noting that it was the highest in the last four decades. With an overall turnout of 58.58 percent, Jammu and Kashmir exhibited strong democratic participation, while the Kashmir Valley recorded a turnout of 51.05 percent. During a press conference in New Delhi, Kumar emphasized that there were no major incidents reported during the polls in any part of the country, including Jammu and Kashmir. This achievement reflects the successful imple-

mentation of security measures and efficient election management by the Election Commission. The recently concluded 7-phase Lok Sabha polls generated significant anticipation, with exit polls indicating a potential landslide victory for the PM Modi-led NDA alliance, projected to secure over 350 seats. As the nation awaits the official counting of votes, scheduled for the coming days, the Election Commission has ensured all necessary arrangements are in place, including heightened security measures, to maintain the integrity and transparency of the electoral process. Mine Blast Injures 4 In East Afghanistan



Asadabad, Afghanistan, June 3 (UNI) Four people have been confirmed injured due to a mine blast that occurred in east Afghanistan's Kunar province on Sunday, provincial police spokesman Faridullah Dehqan said Monday. According to the official, the mine, which was planted in front of a hotel in precinct 1 of the provincial capital Asadabad city, went off on Sunday afternoon, injuring four civilians. Without providing more details, the official added that an investigation is underway and the details would be made public.

Iata Improves Airline Profitability Outlook For 2024 To \$30.5 Bln



Moscow, June 3 (UNI) The world's airlines could make a combined net profit of \$30.5 billion in 2024, surpassing previous estimates by almost 20% and boosting revenue by 9.7% to a new record, the International Air Transport Association (IATA) said on Monday. "Net profits are expected to reach \$30.5 billion in 2024 (3.1% net profit margin). That will be an improvement on 2023 net profits, which are estimated to be \$27.4 billion (3.0% net profit margin). It is also an [18.6%] improvement on the \$25.7 billion (2.7% net profit margin) forecast for 2024 profits that IATA released in December 2023," the association said in a statement. Total airline revenues are

expected to reach a record high of \$996 billion, up 9.7% from 2023's \$908 billion, according to the estimates. However, total expenses are also expected to reach a record high of \$936 billion in 2024, up 9.4% from 2023. "Operating profits are expected to reach \$59.9 billion in 2024, up from an estimated \$52.2 billion in 2023," the statement read. Between 2020 and 2022, the

industry suffered annual losses that totaled \$3.5 billion in 2022. "An inventory of 38.7 million flights is expected to be available in 2024. This is 1.4 million flights below previous estimates (December 2023) largely attributable to the slowing pace of deliveries in the face of persistent supply chain issues in the aerospace sector," the association added. In terms of passenger traffic, IATA expects that a total of 4.964 billion people will use commercial airlines in 2024, up 9.3% from the pre-pandemic level of 2019 and potentially setting a new record, while air cargo traffic is expected to reach 62 billion tonnes.

Israeli Strikes Kill 12 In Syria's Aleppo



Damascus, June 3 (UNI) Israeli airstrikes after midnight Monday killed 12 pro-Iranian militias in Syria's northern province of Aleppo, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said. The militias, consisting of Syrian and non-Syrian nationals, have a significant presence in the area surrounding the city of Aleppo, it said. The attack hit several sites in the countryside of Aleppo, mainly in the town of Hayyan northwest of Aleppo. Several explosions were heard across the city. The observatory noted that the attack comes as part of an escalation of Israeli attacks on positions held by the Lebanese Hezbollah and Iranian militias in Syria since last month. Meanwhile, the Syrian Defense Ministry confirmed that several individuals were killed in the Israeli aggression targeting points near Aleppo.

5.5-Magnitude Quake Hits Northern Mid-Atlantic Ridge-Gfz



Beijing, June 3 (UNI) An earthquake with a magnitude of 5.5 jolted the Northern Mid-Atlantic Ridge at 0641 GMT on Monday, the GFZ German Research Centre for Geosciences said. The epicenter, with a depth of 10.0 km, was initially determined to be at 29.87 degrees north latitude and 42.87 degrees west longitude.

4-Day Anti-Polio Campaign Kicks Off In Afghanistan

Kabul, June 3 (UNI) Afghanistan's second nationwide anti-polio campaign of 2024 kicked off on Monday, aiming to protect Afghan children from paralysis, according to a statement by the country's Ministry of Public Health. During the four-day campaign until June 6, more than 11.2 million children under five will be given polio vaccines,



the statement said. "The Ministry of Public Health is committed

to eradicating the wild poliovirus with the cooperation of its partners in Afghanistan," said the newly-appointed Acting Minister of Public Health Mawlawi Noor Jalal Jalali. There had been no reported cases of wild poliovirus in Afghanistan for five consecutive months, the World Health Organization reported in March.

S. Korea Decides To Suspend Military Agreement With Dprk

Seoul, June 3 (UNI) South Korea decided Monday to suspend the Sept. 19 military agreement with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK), according to the presidential office. The decision was made during the National Security Council (NSC) working-level meeting, presided over by Principal Deputy National Security Adviser Kim Tae-hyo. The agenda to halt the entire effect of the military agreement will be presented to South Korea's cabinet meeting on Tuesday for approval, the presidential of

fice said. The agreement was signed by defense chiefs of the two Koreas during the 2018 inter-Korean summit in Pyongyang to stop all hostile acts across the border.



2 Japanese Fighter Jets Make Emergency Landings

Tokyo, June 3 (UNI) Two F-35A fighter jets of the Japan Air Self-Defense Force (ASDF) made emergency landings at north Japan's Aomori Airport on Monday morning, with no reports of injuries. The two fighter jets, both from the Misawa Air Base, made emergency landings one after another at 8:46 a.m. and 8:56 a.m. local time, respectively. Both pilots, one in each aircraft, were unharmed, and no external damage has been reported, national news agency Kyodo reported. The runway, which was temporarily closed by the airport for approxi-



mately 20 minutes following the landings, has been reopened, causing no major disruptions. Details and causes of the emergency landings are under investigation.

Ex-Malaysian Pm Blames Aggressive U.s. Leadership For Escalating Conflicts: Media

Tokyo, June 3 (UNI) Former Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad has voiced concern about aggressive U.S. leadership and its unyielding stances which had been perpetuating global discord, cautioning that the world might be heading toward war if the U.S. continues to antagonize Russia, Nikkei Asia reported. In an interview on the sidelines of Nikkei's Future of Asia forum in Tokyo, Mahathir said Americans have not learned any lessons from past wars, the Japanese newspaper website said on

Saturday. "The U.S. regards anybody who challenges them as the enemy, which is why we have problems involving the U.S. with Iran, Russia and China. The U.S. is not tolerant. People cannot be 100 percent exactly like you. We accept the differences," Mahathir said. Mahathir argued that the U.S. has long sought to maintain its dominant position on the global stage since the end of the Cold War, viewing the rise of other nations, especially China, as a direct threat, said the report.

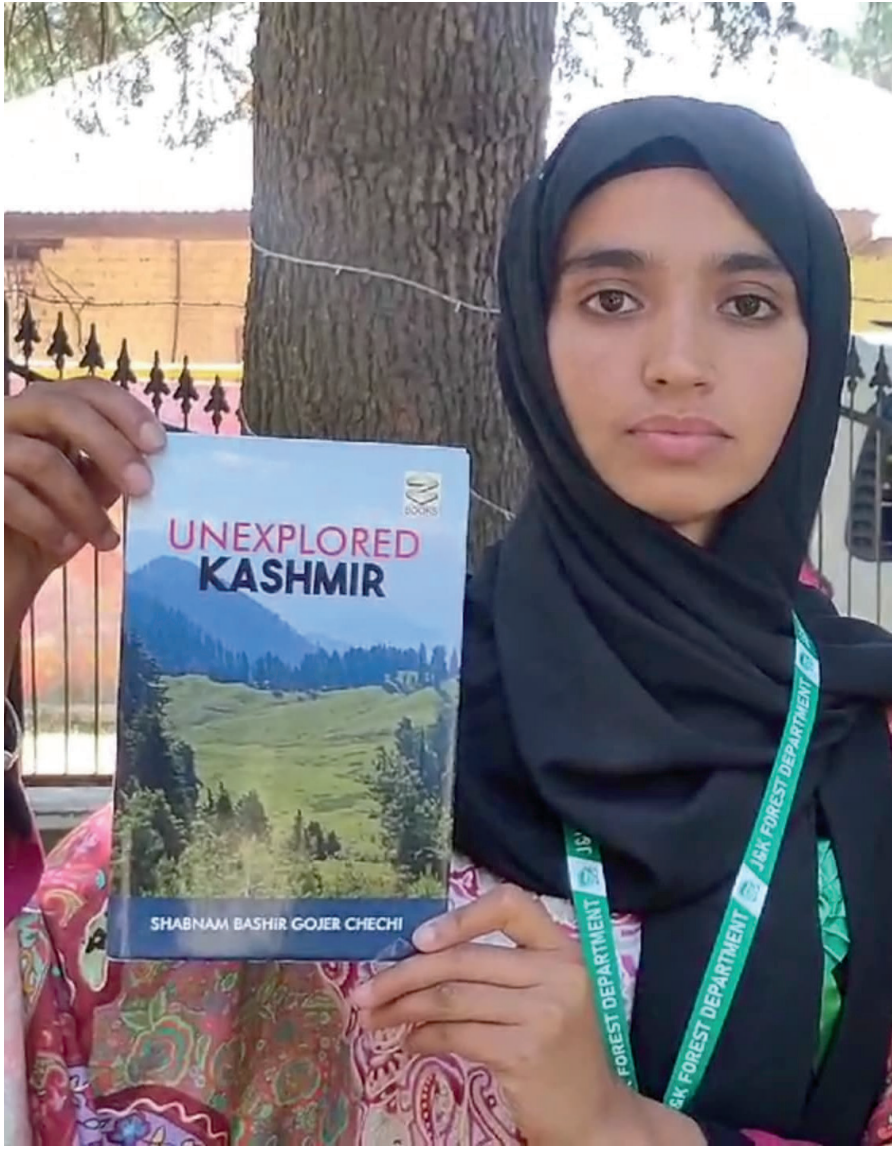
Bandipora, 03 June: Shabnum Bashir Gojer Chechi, a 24-year-old a young tribal girl from Quil Muqam village of North Kashmir's Bandipora district is a tourism researcher who is working towards promoting unexplored tourism destinations in the Harmukh Mountains region of the district.

Shabnum Bashir Gojer Chechi became the author of her first book "Unexplored Kashmir" after taking a tour of around eight far-flung meadows of north Kashmir, scripting them in detail for their tourist potential.

While speaking to media Shabnum shared her experience how she ventured beyond conventional tourist destinations, seeking unexplored destinations with immense potential. She said this pursuit stemmed from a childhood dream of doing something unique and contributing to the local economy, particularly for the youth.

She said she has been visiting these places for the past years wherein she explored several tourist destinations, immersing herself in the beauty of lush green meadows embraced by dense forests. These unexplored destinations include Nachni, Badi Dumgali, Choti Dumgali, Danna, Kemsar, Lashkoot, Banzuri, and Naagmarg.

The explorer's findings highlight the potential of these unexplored meadows to enthrall adventure seekers and nature enthusiasts. Shabnum's research delves into the beauty of Kash-



mir's unexplored meadows located in the upper reaches of the Harmukh ranges. Her book sheds light on the region's natural wonders, including lush green slopes, fresh water sources,

and diverse flora and fauna to compile her research, Shabnum adopted a multi-pronged approach. She not only consulted secondary sources like tribal folklore passed down

through generations, but also embarked on firsthand explorations. By visiting these meadows and interacting with the local tribal communities, she gained a deeper under-

LS Polls: Wait Over, Results Today!

Counting of votes for 5 J&K LS seats today amid multi-layer security cover; 2500 security personnel deployed to secure counting centres, 1000 agents given access cards, to report at 6 AM

Srinagar, Jun 03 : Finally the big day has arrived as the counting of votes will start today (Tuesday) for the five crucial Lok Sabha seats of Jammu and Kashmir amid multi-layer security cover.

The Election Commission has established 10 counting centers for the five Lok Sabha seats in J&K with one of these centers set up in Delhi to count the votes of Kashmiri migrants living outside Kashmir. The counting of votes for five J&K LS seats will begin simultaneously with the rest of the country. Early Results for Ladakh and Udhampur

As per news agency among the six Lok Sabha seats of Jammu, Kashmir, and Ladakh, the results for Udhampur and Ladakh are expected first. The results for the re-

maining four seats—Jammu, Anantnag-Rajori, Srinagar, and Baramulla—will take longer due to the high number of candidates, which has necessitated the use of two EVMS for each seat.

Key Candidates Await Results
The fate of over 100 candidates, including prominent figures like Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh, former Chief Ministers Omar Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti, will be decided on June 4. Other notable candidates include former minister Chaudhary Lal Singh, MP Jugal Kishore Sharma, Congress working president Raman Bhalla, veteran NC leaders Mian Altaf and Ruhullah Mehdi, Apni Party's Zafar Iqbal Manhas and Mohd. Ashraf Mir, People's Conference chief Sajjad Gani Lone, and Awa-

mi Ittehad Party chief Engineer Rashid. In Ladakh, the results will determine the fate of BJP's Tashi Gyal-san, Congress's T Namgyal, and independent Haji Hanifa Jaan.

Security and Preparations for Counting
Section 144 has been imposed outside the counting centers, which will remain in effect until June 5. The district administration has issued I-cards to personnel on counting duty, and around 1,000 agents have been given access cards. Approximately 2,000 to 2,500 personnel have been deployed for vote counting. A meeting was held between District Deputy Commissioners Sachin Kumar and the election candidates and their agents to ensure smooth vote counting.

"We seized Rs 10,000 crores in cash, nearly 3 times the value seized in 2019," he added. The seven phase of polling for the 18th Lok Sabha ended on June 1, while the counting of votes will take place June 4. The CEC informed that only 39 re-polls took place in 2024 general elections as against 540 re-polls in 2019. "The Election Commission disposed of over 90 per cent of 495 major complaints related to Model Code of Conduct violation," he said.

De Minaur Ends Australia's 20-Year French Open Quarterfinal Drought



Paris, June 3 (UNI) Alex de Minaur ended a 20-year Australian drought at the French Open on Monday, overcoming fifth seed Daniil Medvedev 4-6, 6-2, 6-1, 6-3 to advance to his first Roland Garros quarterfinal. De Minaur, seeded 11th, became the first Australian to reach the last eight at the clay-court Grand Slam since Lleyton Hewitt in 2004. The victory on Suzanne Lenglen Court was aided by Medvedev's mid-match struggle with a foot problem. Medvedev, a former Paris quarterfinalist, had a strong record against De Minaur, having lost only twice in their previous eight encounters. He secured an early break in the third game and took the first set without much trouble, despite De Minaur's persistent defense. However, De Minaur rallied in the second set, profiting from Medvedev's unforced errors and a medical timeout for blisters. With the momentum on his side, the 25-year-old Australian surged to a 5-1 lead in the third set and sealed it convincingly. In the fourth set, De Minaur and Medvedev exchanged early breaks before De Minaur pulled ahead to secure a memorable win. This victory marks a significant milestone for De Minaur and Australian tennis.

Record Prize Money Announced For T20 World Cup 2024

Dubai, June 3 (UNI) The International Cricket Council (ICC) has unveiled a record-breaking prize fund of \$11.25 million USD for the Men's T20 World Cup 2024, with the champions set to receive an unprecedented \$2.45 million. This announcement marks the highest prize money in the history of the tournament. The ninth edition of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup features 20 teams competing over 28 days across nine venues in the West Indies and the USA, making it the largest event of its kind. The runners-up will be awarded \$1.28 million, while the losing semi-

finalists will each receive \$787,500. Teams that do not progress beyond the second round will receive



\$382,500 each, and those finishing between ninth and twelfth place will be awarded \$247,500 each. Teams ranking from thirteenth to twentieth place will each earn \$225,000. Additionally, every team will receive an extra \$31,154 for each match won, excluding the semi-finals and final.

The tournament will commence with 40 matches in the first round, leading to the Super 8s, followed by the semifinals in Trinidad and Tobago and Guyana. The championship will culminate at the Kensington Oval in Barbados, where the 2024 men's champions will be crowned. ICC Chief Executive Geoff Allardice commented on the event's historic significance: "This event is historic in so many ways, so it is fitting that the prize money for players reflects that. Hundreds of millions of fans around the world will be entertained by the players in what we're hoping to be an Out of This World event."



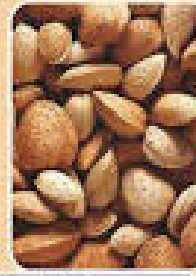

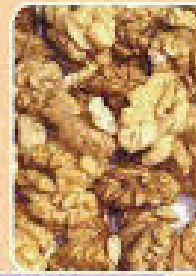

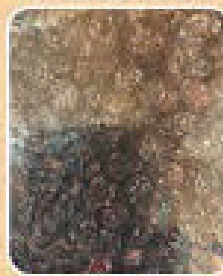
